Many will remember William Morchouse who graduated May 21, 1943 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture (major--entomology). He went overseas in June 1944. Morchouse was killed in action in France on July 19, 1944.

William was born on November 15, 1921 at Ottumwa, Iowa. Six months later his family moved to Omaha, Nebraska. In 1927 the family again moved--this time to St. Louis, Missouri. After residing in St. Louis for a year, residence was changed to Dallas, Texas. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Morchouse, now reside at 2751 Kingston Street, Dallas, Texas.

He attended the Dallas public schools, graduating from Sunset High School in the spring of 1939. In the fall of 1939 he entered North Texas Agricultural College and completed the two year course there in May 1941. Upon entering Texas A. & M. in September, 1941, he majored in entomology, and his ambition was to become a research entomologist.

William was very fond of the outdoors, and this fondness was cultivated by several summer attendances at the Y. M. C. A. camp. He was very interested in writing short stories and essays. He was also a very active worker in the Presbyterian Church.
